

Evolution of the Covenant of Mayors – Europe






Embedded into wider climate policy



- The world's largest movement of cities taking climate and energy action
- Embedded in the EU climate & energy policies (Green Deal, EU adaptation strategy...)
- Connected to other EU city initiatives
 to best support cities in delivering on their
 ambition (EU Climate Pact, Green City
 Accord...)
- Allowing easier access to funding (LIFE, Horizon Europe, Recovery...)
- Ensuring a stronger voice on the international scene



The Covenant Commitments in Europe

- 55% GHG emission reduction by 2030 & climate neutrality target by 2050
- Increasing resilience and prepare for the adverse impacts of climate change,
- Tackle energy poverty as one key action to ensure a just transition.

Adopt the Covenant commitments by municipal council decision

Register on <u>eumayors.eu</u> and upload signed commitment text

ACT



Set city targets and goals

Complete inventories and assessments for mitigation and adaptation pillars

Develop Sustainable Energy and Climate Action Plan (SECAP)

Implement actions, monitor, and report on a Covenant-Europe platform

ENGAGE



Develop a local climate pact or similar

Mobilise pledges from citizens, businesses, and government at all levels

Ensure stakeholder participation in both development and implementation of climate action

NETWORK



Prepare good practice examples of action implemented

Participate in global and regional advocacy activities



SECAP reporting cycle





Develop a Sustainable Energy and Climate Action Plan (SECAP) including mitigation, adaptation, energy poverty, and a just transition.


Report to the Covenant-Europe.

Monitor SECAP implementation and report progress every 2 years, fulfilling the minimum requirements as specified in the Covenant-Europe reporting guidelines.

Include updates of monitoring emission inventories at least every 4 years and include updates of climate risk and vulnerability assessments as information becomes available.

- Being part of a Community
