

5TH LOCAL STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING TÜRKİYE 05.12.2023

On the 5th of December, in a recent milestone event, the 5th Local Steering Committee Meeting of the EU4Energy Transition: Western Balkans and Türkiye Project showcased remarkable progress and collaboration among stakeholders.



Welcome Address and keynote speakers included **Ms. Rasa Suraučienė**, Deputy Director, CPMA, **Mr. Christian Ballaro**, Program Officer for Energy, Environment and Climate Change, EUD to Türkiye, **Mr. Ričardas Degutis**, Ambassador, Embassy of the Republic of Lithuania to the Republic of Türkiye, to Islamic Republic of Iran, to Islamic Republic of Pakistan.




Ms. Daiva Matoniene's presentation highlighted significant achievements in the project's past six months, including successful MLGP platform testing, collaborations with GCoM and JRC, SECAP development, grant project implementation, and robust visibility efforts. Key outcomes were outlined for each project output, showcasing successful engagement with municipalities, ministries, and regional institutions.



Ms. Gizem Mataracı presented the Capacity Building Training Model and the EU4ETTR 2023 Observer Municipality Strategy, emphasizing SECAP support and capacity building. **Ms. Mataracı** expressed satisfaction with the timely implementation of training sessions and thanked experts and participants.

During the discussion section, participants emphasized the structured approach of the project and the need for sustained connections with related ministries for long-term sustainability. The importance of addressing energy poverty in SECAPs and showcasing successful municipalities as models for others was also highlighted.

Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality Showcases Climate Action Success at LSC Meeting

Ms. Meryem Kayan from Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality (IMM) recently shared its green achievements. Their plan for Sustainable Energy and Climate Action (SECAP) got approved after thorough checks by the Assembly Environment and Law commissions. Mayor Ekrem İmamoğlu's involvement in the SECAP event emphasized the city's commitment to being open and proactive about climate action.



Representatives from Bağcılar and Melikgazi municipalities took center stage, shedding light on their notable progress and contributions.



Bağcılar Municipality, part of the Global Covenant of Mayors (GCoM), presented a groundbreaking project funded by the Central Project Management Agency (CPMA). The PV Panel project, presented by **Mr. Faruk Şit**, a crucial part of the "Bağcılar Impact Resource Mitigation Project," aims to generate 203.9 MWh of energy, covering 11% of municipal buildings.

Melikgazi Municipality is dedicated to addressing climate and energy concerns. The Solar City Project, presented by **Mr. Özcan Caymaz** and backed by CPMA, aims to boost renewable energy use. It includes solar-powered charging stations, photovoltaic panels on municipal buildings, and a focus on solar energy for waste collection vehicles. With a modern approach, according to the SECAP report, to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 776,460 tCO2 (58.1% reduction) by the year 2030. Bağcılar Municipality has initiated the Women's Academy program which includes conducting seminars for women about "Clean Society and Clean

Ms. Esra Yüce shared Bağcılar Municipalty's SECAP progress. Bağcılar Municipality has committed,

Environment" and "Prevention of Waste" in 28 associations, with the goal of reaching 5,000 women in 50 associations by the end of February.







Melikgazi Municipality targets a substantial reduction of 100 tons of emissions per year, making a significant contribution to environmental efforts.

Global Accord on Green Energy Transition Achieved at COP28

Between November 30 and December 12, delegates from nearly 200 nations convened to synchronize efforts for global climate action over the next year in an event known as COP28.

What are the key take-aways?



COP28 witnessed significant strides in global climate action, marked by the **establishment of a climate disaster fund**, emphasizing urgent funding needs for vulnerable communities.



A groundbreaking commitment emerged as countries explicitly addressed the imperative to **shift away from fossil fuels**, setting a historic net-zero target for 2050.



The push for renewables took center stage, urging **a threefold increase in global renewable energy capacity** by 2030.



The summit underscored the accountability of developed nations to fulfill climate finance commitments and agreed on **a post-2025 finance target**.



Despite progress, the global stocktake emphasized the inadequacy of current efforts in achieving the 1.5°C goal, underscoring **the need for intensified global actions** to address the pressing challenges posed by the climate crisis.

COP28 witnessed a momentous leap as nearly every nation worldwide committed to the "Green energy transition," signifying an unprecedented achievement. This marks the first-ever global consensus on energy transition in the 28-year history of international climate negotiations.

"Enhancing International Cooperation and Platform Development in Climate Actions" occurred on December 8, 2023 at COP28 in Dubai, UAE

In this examplar cooperation, EU4ETTR Project collaborated with the representatives from the Ministry of Environment, Urbanization, and Climate Change, Global Covenant of Mayors, Joint Resarch Center, and Bağcılar Municipality for a pivotal panel discussion. This collaboration provided a platform for global leaders, government officials, NGOs, and climate advocates to explore the successes and challenges of climate action initiatives.



Distinguished speakers, including Dr. Tuğba Dinçbaş, Daiva Matoniene, Piero Remitti, and Dr. Paolo Bertoldi, shared insights on Türkiye's evolving climate legislation, multi-level governance platforms, citylevel cooperation, and the EU Joint Research Center's role in cities' climate resilience. The spotlight was on Bağcılar Municipality's concrete renewable energy implementations under Sustainable Energy and Climate Action Plans (SECAPs).


CAPACITY BUILDING TRAININGS HAVE BEEN COMPLETED

2023 CLIMATE ACHIEVEMENTS IN EUROPE



Last year, the economic activities of EU resident units resulted in the emission of 3.6 billion tonnes of CO2 equivalents (CO2-eq), reflecting a 22% reduction compared to the levels observed in 2008.

CENTRAL PROJECT MANAGEMENT AGENCY



Last year, the proportion of renewable sources in the gross final energy consumption across the EU reached 23.0%, indicating a 1.1 percentage points (pp) increase compared to the previous year, 2021.



According to the latest Energy Efficiency 2023 report from the International Energy Agency (IEA), **Lithuania** is set to elevate its energy efficiency by nearly 12%, surpassing the EU average of 8%.








