



Climate Actions: Reporting & Monitorng

In the aftermath of the **Paris Agreement**, nations worldwide have committed to ambitious climate goals, pledging to cut down on greenhouse gas emissions through nationally determined contributions and an increasing adoption of net-zero targets. While progress has been made in implementing these commitments, there's a clear and urgent need for additional action to reduce emissions. **Achieving these climate targets requires a strategic, evidence-based approach**, where policymakers rely on insights into the effectiveness of various policy measures under diverse conditions.

Monitoring and reporting on climate actions and policies become crucial guides for nations in their efforts to succeed in climate mitigation. This is especially vital because there are significant gaps in keeping track and evaluating countries' efforts. Such monitoring serves as a compass, helping nations navigate the path toward successful climate action. As countries intensify their efforts, the importance of sharing best practices and fostering peer-learning becomes increasingly apparent, steering the global community towards a more sustainable and resilient future.

IMPORTANCE OF REPORTING CLIMATE DATA



• Simplified Monitoring System (MRV): It functions as a simplified MRV system, employing the measure, report, verify approach to track progress over time.



• Enhanced Transparency and Political Commitment:
Reporting enhances transparency, offering a visual
representation of political commitment to climate-related goals.



Data to Knowledge for Local Action: The process transforms
data into valuable information and knowledge, informing local
climate action and facilitating acceleration efforts.



• **Improved Data Quality:** Continuous reporting leads to improved data quality, ensuring increasing accuracy and coherence over time.



• Identification of Data Gaps: Reporting identifies data gaps, paving the way for resolution with support from organizations like the Global Covenant of Mayors for Climate and Energy (GCoM).



 Mapping of Trends: Widespread reporting enables the mapping of national, regional, and global trends, offering insights that inform the need for improvement and financing/investment strategies.



• Aggregation, Comparison, and Monitoring in the Centralized Data Hub: It enables the aggregation, comparison, and monitoring of data over time, facilitating a comprehensive understanding of climate-related developments within the reach of climate experts, decision makers and the citizens.



Global Benchmarking: The GCoM global streamlined reporting process provides a robust benchmark for assessing and comparing climate data globally.




JRC is introduced by Ms. Guillia Melica on 18th of October 2023



Session 2: Showcasing Progress through Collaboration (22.11.2023)


Interactive Training Experience:








MLGP STEERING AND ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING






